NUJ masterclass thrills young creatives



NUJ project worker Catherine Deveney took a leading role in the first taught workshop for the NC Creative Industries course, which is supported by Scottish Union Learning. The 18-month pilot course at Inverness College UHI is being delivered predominantly online, and in partnership with the NUJ and BECTU.

The students, who are located across the Highlands and Islands, met for an induction at Inverness College in April. They returned last month for face to face tuition in some subjects, including creating and managing databases.

However, most of the day was devoted to a masterclass from accomplished interviewer Catherine, who counts Donald Trump and Katie Price in the ranks of her celebrity interviewees. Catherine's interactive session mixed professional tips illustrated with anecdotes from her career as a journalist, earning rave reviews from the learners. The next workshop in October will feature industry insights from BECTU on working in film and television.
