Young People Embark on Careers at Sea



Twenty young people have taken their first steps as deck, engine or retail apprentices with Caledonian MacBrayne. Dan Henderson, RMT Learning Project Worker, was joined by RMT colleague Brian Reynolds to welcome the new recruits as part of their induction at City of Glasgow's Riverside Campus. They are the third group of Modern Apprentices to join CalMac in the last four years and the first to be trained in Scotland under the Modern

Apprenticeship Framework for Maritime Occupations. CalMac has worked closely with the RMT, Scottish Union Learning and industry groups over several years to introduce the maritime MA programme.

This year, in an industry first, 10 retail apprentices will begin 15 months of training in hospitality skills. They will join the 10 deck and engine room apprentices who were also taken on this year.

Under its new eight-year contract, CalMac is committed to develop the maritime Modern Apprenticeship programme and it is hoped that there will soon be options for MAs in IT, Customer Service and Port Operations.
