Workshops



10.45am - 11.30 am: Age Inclusive Workplaces

Highlands and Islands has an ageing workforce, and age-bias is a significant barrier to older workers' wellbeing, progression and development. This workshop, delivered by **Age Scotland** - the National Charity for older people - will encourage us to understand, and recognise, ageism so that we can begin to build inclusive strategies which are consistent with Scotland's Fair Work Framework.

11.45am - 12.30pm Staying Safe Online

We all use public Wi-Fi networks in coffee shops, on trains, or hotels. If that network is set up in an insecure way, criminals can intercept all messages going between your devices and the router. This might include watching what websites you are visiting, capturing the passwords you type in, or reading private messages or emails. This workshop will show you how to use Virtual Private Network software to keep your connection secure. This is a great way to up your cyber security knowledge and confidence. You don't need any technical knowledge or experience to take part.

The workshop will be presented by Craig Steele, Director of **Digital Skills Education**.

1pm - Panel Discussion: Reskilling and upskilling in H&I

SUL Projects in H&I



Educational Institute of Scotland

EIS' H&I project has developed in response to demand amongst members across the region. The Project's objectives focus on meeting the needs of teaching professionals in remote areas. Key strands of the Project's programme are Health and Wellbeing, Mental Health Awareness and Additional Support, within which a wide range of courses on a variety of subjects are planned to help members progress in their professional roles.

Fire Brigade Union

FBU have developed a programme of learning which is directly responsive to the specific needs of H&I members, including mental health awareness, physical health and wellbeing, everyday skills, adult literacy and numeracy, and digital and IT skills.

National Union of Journalists

A long-standing project in Highlands and Island, NUJ's H&I Project develops its learning programmes around key issues including climate change and green issues. Supporting freelance and precarious workers is also an important feature of the Project's work with a focus on widening access into the media industry, challenging stereotypes and supporting minorities.

Scottish Artists Union

Although relatively new, SAU's H&I Project has achieved a great deal in a short space on time. The Project has a planned a programme of 12 courses which includes a mental health support series, sessions on sustainability and climate change, a health and safety in the arts series, dyslexia support and a disability awareness and access series.

National Union of Rail, Maritime and Transport Workers

A long-standing partnership project with a single employer, RMT's H&I Project has contributed significantly to inclusivity, apprenticeships and mental health awareness at Calmac. Recent months have seen the development of a steering group to promote inclusivity across the organisation which grew out of equalities training organised by the project. Other recent initiatives include a mentoring programme to support young apprentices, a digital skills programme and sector-specific mental health learning opportunities.

UNISON

This long-standing H&I project prioritises accredited courses to help members gain qualifications and maximise employability. The project also targets health and social care workers and early years sectors. In addition, a significant part of the project's work focuses on bringing on new learners through the development of an accessible programme of short courses and events.

Unite the Union

Demand for union learning is high amongst Unite members and the H&I project is well placed to support workers in key industries experiencing precarious work and redundancy. The project is able to access the considerable resources and expertise of Unite in meeting workers' learning needs across H&I. The project works across a number of sectors which are important to the region's economy and communities.

Speakers



Wendy Burton

Wendy joined the STUC in 2003 as Adult Literacy Co-ordinator in the Lifelong Learning Unit. In 2008, she took up the post of Development Officer, with a specific remit for Everyday Skills, within Scottish Union Learning, and in June 2015 became Director. Wendy has a BA (Hons) in Politics from Glasgow Caledonian University, and a Master of Education (MEd) from The Open University. Previously, Wendy worked in Higher Education and the NHS, and was a volunteer tutor with several adult learning projects.

Roz Foyer

Roz is the STUC's General Secretary. She has over twenty-five years' experience in the trade union movement. Roz began as a workplace activist in the Benefits Agency. After leading a successful campaign against support services privatisation, she was recruited by the printer workers union as a trainee organiser, before gaining prominence in the Scottish movement as an Assistant Secretary at the STUC. She went on to become a National Officer with the Transport and General Workers Union, later moving into Unite's National Organising Department. She excelled as a strategist who delivered a series of successful membership campaigns. Her role as General Secretary of the STUC involves representing over half a million trade unionists in Scotland, co-ordinating, developing and articulating the views and policies of the trade union movement.

Richard Lochhead, MSP

Richard was appointed Minister for Just Transition, Employment and Fair Work in May 2021. He was elected to the Scottish Parliament in 1999 and 2003 via the North East regional list. During the second session of Parliament he stood down from his regional seat and was elected as constituency MSP for Moray in the by-election in April 2006.
